# Project Synopsis

## Description

This project will fund a residential and community outreach center providing hope to impoverished children in urban slums.

## Purpose

To provide nourishing meals, inspiring educational support and Christ-centered spiritual formation so at-risk children can discover their God-given gifts.

## Our Partners

Friendship Home, a mission of the Amigonian Fathers and Brothers.

## Location

Malate, an impoverished area of metropolitan Manila.

## Cost

\$37,200 to cover the mission's expenses for a year.

## Highlights

- Friendship Home is a response by spirit-filled Catholics to the tragic reality of children growing up in squalor.
- It is both a residential home for children with nowhere to turn and a community outreach center for children from destitute families.
- The Catholic ministry provides educational support, nutritional programs, health care, recreational opportunities and — when needed — safe shelter.
- The brothers and priests emphasize prayer and spiritual formation for children and their families.
- Cross Catholic Outreach has committed to funding this life-changing ministry for the coming year, but we need your help!

## The Need

Our Lord certainly doesn't want his children living in cramped shacks on the squalid, filthy streets of Malate — but sadly, this has been the fate of Reyanne Cabia-an Ramos.

The 13-year-old girl and her family are crammed into a place so tiny and rundown that it would be misleading to think of it as even a basic home. In fact, it barely qualifies as a shelter from the elements. The one-room shack is one of many that line the streets. Thought of as street-dwellings, they are unsuitable for even the smallest family. It has no bathroom, and it sits near open sewers, a polluted canal and piles of street garbage. As a result, a stench hangs like a malignant fog over the place day and night.

To make matters worse, Reyanne's family is paying \$30 in rent each month for the privilege of living there, making it difficult for them to afford other necessities, including food for the children.

While \$30 for rent may not seem like a large expense, that is not the case. The economy in the developing world is far different from what most Americans would expect or experience. For example, Reyanne's mother has a job as a helper at a private school – but only earns \$2 a day. Others are even less fortunate. Those families literally live on the crime-ridden streets, huddling at night under tarps or behind scraps of wood for protection. Tragically, children can even be found facing these terrible situations on their own. Malate is home to a large number of street children who are orphaned or abandoned by their parents, and sadly, many turn to gangs for acceptance when no other options are available.

Fortunately for Reyanne, she has a mother who believes in her future and will work hard to provide her with security and opportunities to grow. The Church wants to play a role in this too — and you can support their efforts! **By empowering the Friendship Home, you can help give Reyanne and children like her a path out of poverty.**



## Ministry Description

The vision for the Friendship Home comes from the words of Jesus — “Which one of you, having 100 sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the 99 in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?” (Luke 15:4).

Brother Luis Ortiz has been living out that parable since 1991, when he founded the Friendship Home. Only, he is not searching for lost sheep but for children who are lost in the hopeless wilderness of urban despair.

Society has been willing to ignore the children living in Manila’s slums, but Brother Luis and his fellow Amigonian Fathers and Brothers believe in the childrens’ potential. To break a cycle of illiteracy and poverty, Friendship Home incentivizes extremely poor children and youths, ages 8 to 21, to stay in school, earn their diploma and even go to college.

### **The ministry serves 100 students by:**

- Covering the prohibitive costs of uniforms and school supplies.
- Providing academic tutoring and homework assistance.
- Leading field trips.
- Providing a nutritious breakfast and lunch.
- Performing health screenings.
- Offering spiritual retreats and faith formation.
- Requiring students to participate in enrichment and accountability services.

college, De La Salle-College of St. Benilde. But even those who don’t pursue college have benefited by developing the skills, motivation and character to break free of the cycle of poverty.

With such support, these children certainly are not lost sheep any longer. They are a Christian community. The older students tutor the younger students, and everyone must help cook, clean and maintain the facility.

Some of the boys — those in the most desperate circumstances — live on-site, while the rest are encouraged to pursue a healthy family life at home. Brother Luis engages the parents through home visits and adult Bible studies, so the nurturing environment of Friendship Home can be replicated beyond its doors.

Some students do so well that they qualify for full scholarships that are available at a local Catholic
