Project Synopsis

Description

This project will deliver twice-a-week hot meals to homebound elderly individuals and help them participate in monthly health-focused social gatherings at the local Hope Center.

Purpose

To bring comfort, dignity and companionship to poor, elderly Belizeans who might otherwise live out their twilight years alone.

Location

Punta Gorda, part of the Toledo District in the tiny Central American country of Belize.

Cost

\$8,728 will fund nutritious meals twice a week to 25 homebound elderly persons for one year.

Highlights

- Hearing Jesus' call to serve the poor, the Pallottine Missionary Sisters operate HOPE as part of their 70-year ministry to Belize's "Forgotten District."
- Your generous gift to Cross Catholic Outreach will fund the sisters' Food for the Aged program, which provides meals and socialization for elderly shut-ins with no one to care for them.
- Once a month, 150 elderly are brought to a social at the local HOPE center, where they benefit from medical exams, health education and exercise.
- The HOPE program also serves the indigent elderly by providing house repairs and tending to their spiritual needs.

The Need

The quiet seaport town of Punta Gorda in southern Belize may seem like a great place to “get away from it all,” but for the indigent elderly who live within its poorest neighborhoods, life can feel like a prison sentence without end — a place of isolation, squalor and indignity.

The sad truth is that Punta Gorda has long suffered from high rates of illiteracy and unemployment, and poverty plagues many in its elderly population. Disintegrating roads and ramshackle houses fill the “Forgotten District,” which receives few government support, and when that area’s residents become too old to work at all, they often end up in dire circumstances. A tragic number of them have no retirement savings, no benefits to fall back on, and no other means of support.

Even those lucky enough to be able to stay with family often suffer, spending most of their time by themselves while their relatives are out working. A cultural breakdown of the traditional family has weakened the bonds that used to tie the old and young together, with the result that needy elders are not close with their children.

Without a personal caretaker, these elderly men and women feel neglected and helpless and often go hungry. Simple activities such as going to church or visiting a friend down the road become too difficult, and they withdraw, resigned to living out their twilight years in solitude as they succumb to rapid physical and mental deterioration.

Fortunately, there is an alternative to this tragic fate. With your support, Cross Catholic Outreach can offer these precious men and women a better life through a compassionate local outreach appropriately named HOPE.



Ministry Description

Founded by the Pallottine Missionary Sisters, HOPE seeks “to promote good physical, mental and social well-being in a caring environment for older persons in Punta Gorda.”

The name stands for Helping Older People Equally, signifying that the ministry’s door is open to any elderly man or woman, regardless of faith, creed or color.

Once a month, the sisters invite the elderly to a social event at the local HOPE center. At this event, participants benefit from medical screenings, health information, physical exercise, nutritious snacks and games. The program also offers special retreats and access to Mass for those who would otherwise struggle to participate in church life.

“Sometimes people don’t want to come out of their homes,” one sister told us. “They say, ‘I’m not ready; I’m not ready.’ But then they change their minds at the last minute and want to come.”

“Sometimes we’re the only ones they’ll see during the whole week,” another sister shared. “A sad situation.”

For the 25 most vulnerable individuals this project serves, the sisters also deliver hot meals twice a week. The home feeding outreach is a huge blessing to those who, for both financial and physical reasons, often go hungry.

HOPE relies to a large extent on volunteers and local donations. For example, community businesses give vegetables and fruit to feed the elderly. But more support is needed to reach all in need of aid. That’s why we are appealing to you today to join Cross Catholic Outreach in funding the Pallottine Missionary Sisters’ work with the indigent elderly of Punta Gorda. This is an effort that truly embodies the love of Christ for the “least among us,” and we invite you to help demonstrate that love!
