## Project Synopsis

### Description

Through this project, 315 impoverished children will be equipped to succeed in school, develop more ambitious goals and grow in faith. Your gift will allow for these children to benefit from health campaigns where they will have access to deworming drugs and vitamins.

### Purpose

To enable street children and children from destitute families to build a way out of poverty.

### Cost

### Highlights

- Extreme poverty ravages the slums of San Lorenzo, where families live without running water and adequate food.
- Families are unable to afford the costs of education, so children work at manual labor for meager wages, or they resort to life on the streets.
- Suffering has increased because of the COVID-19 pandemic, which further restricts families' access to food, work and education.
- Hearing Jesus' call to serve the poor, Salesian priests created Chicos de la Calle, which now operates five ministry centers in Ecuador.
- Children in the San Lorenzo center receive classroom supplies and tutoring. They grow in faith and self-esteem through spiritual formation and recreational activities.
- All of this depends on the support of Cross Catholic Outreach. Through your gift, the Salesian missionaries can inspire destitute children to break the bonds of poverty!

## The Need

The crushing poverty of San Lorenzo has forced Miguel to work grueling 13-hour days at a local bakery — even though he is only in the fifth grade. Elizabeth, the mother of this young man, regrets the extremely long workdays her young son puts in, but she feels there is no choice. The family needs the meager income his job supplies.

The Montanos are tragically typical of the impoverished families living in the slums of San Lorenzo. Most live in one-room shacks without safe water or bathrooms. In this community, adults work for meager wages when they can find work at all, and gangs prey upon their children and put them at risk of being lured into prostitution or the drug trade.

This region on the border of Colombia also faces violence and economic hardships not seen in other parts of Ecuador. Government and paramilitary forces have been at war for decades in Colombia, with the unrest spilling over the border into San Lorenzo.

For destitute families like the Montanos, escaping poverty seems impossible — no matter how hard they try. Elizabeth's husband works hard on a palm oil farm, but his meager earnings are not enough for even basic necessities. Elizabeth, who cares for three younger children, can make some additional money gathering clams and mussels, but that work is filthy and challenging. To earn even a little extra, she and other unskilled local residents enter muddy mangroves with water up to their chests and grope for hours searching for shellfish. The profit is just pennies for each shellfish they find, and most earn just \$2 a day.

In the midst of such poverty, much of what we consider normal childhood activities — education, faith formation, school groups and teams — are unattainable luxuries and this too weighs on Elizabeth and her husband. They wanted so much more for their children, but they see no way to get ahead in life.

Thankfully, Jesus hasn't forgotten the poor in San Lorenzo and neither has the Church! Inspired by God and with a desire to demonstrate the compassion of Christ, the caring team at Chicos de la Calle wants to restore the gift of childhood to San Lorenzo's children and create a future of hope. ***You can help them accomplish both!***



## Ministry Description

Jesus welcomed children during his earthly ministry, and he is still calling boys and girls to join him today – especially those from the poor areas of San Lorenzo. ### Mind
