Executive Summary

Description

Families in the coastal region of Ecuador live in extreme poverty, and the impact of COVID-19 has only added to their hardships. Work is difficult to find, so parents are finding it increasingly challenging to feed their children and buy the supplies needed for school. In a region filled with gangs and drugs, these struggling boys and girls are at risk. They can be lured away from their families by exploitive people or end up living on the streets. A Catholic ministry is eager to address these problems, but it needs our help to offer wholesome alternatives to local children being tempted into a life of drugs and crime. Your generous support will empower the Salesians of Don Bosco — Catholic priests dedicated to serving impoverished youth — and will enable them to offer important outreaches to the communities they serve. Ecuador Salesian Project - in the city of Esmeraldas, for example, will be equipped to provide educational support, nourishing meals, engaging group activities and spiritual encouragement. These are critical services if children are to escape their hopelessness and grow strong in mind, body and spirit.

NEED

- More than 25 percent of people in Ecuador live in poverty, according to the World Bank, with many congregated in urban squalor on the fringes of cities like Esmeraldas.
- Children grow up illiterate and malnourished because parents can't afford food or school expenses.
- Gangs prey on children who have no hope, drawing them into a life of addiction and crime.

IMPACT

- Ecuador Salesian Project - in the city of Esmeraldas, provides 515 impoverished children with daily tutoring and nutritional supplements so they can stay in school and succeed.
- For 80 boys and girls most at risk of malnutrition, the ministry offers health checks and prepares nutritious daily meals.
- Lively recreational activities and joyful faith formation lead children to develop personal goals and trust in God.

Without healthy group activities, they never learn self-confidence or explore the benefits of positive teamwork. Instead, they are drawn into gangs or drugs, which seem to offer power and an escape from their pain.
